

Lely High School Hires Stacey Stewart as Head Football Coach

Lely High School would like to announce the hiring of Stacey Stewart as their new head football coach. Coach Stewart has been coaching high school football for 18 years with stops in Florida and Georgia, including Sante Fe High School (FL), Lowndes County High School (GA), and most recently at Camden County High School (GA).

Stewart, a 1987 graduate of Lely High School, was a two-year starter at quarterback for the Trojans and was named captain his senior year. "My heart is here at Lely, and I am excited to come back home with my Lely family," said Stewart.

As a Varsity Assistant Coach at Sante Fe High School, Stewart helped the team win three straight District titles and a Regional Championship in 1998. From 2002-04, Stewart was a Varsity Assistant Coach for Lowndes High School in Valdosta, GA. During this time, Stewart was able to learn under Head Coach Randy McPherson, who has three state titles since 2003.

Since 2004, Coach Stewart has been a Physical Education Teacher and Varsity Assistant Football Coach at Camden County High School in Kingsland, GA. Under the tutelage of Head Coach Jeff Herron, Stewart has helped Camden County to a 97-11 record with two state titles and eight straight regional crowns. Moreover, Camden County is consistently ranked nationally in the Top 25, including a span at #2 in the country in 2010. Along with success on the field, recent graduates that played under Stewart are now attending such universities as South Carolina, Missouri State, and Marshall.

Upon his arrival, Stewart will serve as an instructional staff member and will assume the head coaching duties for the Trojan Football Program.
